

Verification of Transition from Institutional or Other Segregated Setting

Institutional and other segregated settings include, but are not limited to:

- *Congregate settings populated exclusively or primarily with individuals with disabilities; or*
- *Congregate settings characterized by regimentation in daily activities, lack of privacy or autonomy, policies limiting visitors, or limits on individuals' ability to engage freely in community activities and to manage their own activities of daily living; or*
- *Settings that provide daytime activities primarily with other individuals with disabilities.*

Verification of Transition Plan must include the following information:

1. A description of the setting to confirm it meets the definition of an institutional or other segregated setting as stated above.
2. Confirmation that the applicant is a resident of the institutional or other segregated setting.
3. Verification that there is a plan for the applicant to leave the facility within three months.

Example 1:

This letter is to confirm that Anne X Ample has been a resident of the Mid-Town Re-entry Program, 123 NE Hopespring St., Gresham OR 97030, since 10/4/2018. This six-month transitional housing program is exclusive to individuals with the disability of addiction. Residents progress through phases and follow a strictly regimented schedule. Based on current progress, the estimated exit date will be 4/18/2019.
